Policy Objective

The IFSM Management Committee recognizes that there are times when a sub-committee can act more effectively than can the full committee.

To provide clarity around the delegation of powers for IFSC sub-committees.

Policy

The IFSC Management Committee has the authority to establish sub-committees and may co-opt general association members and should include at least one Management Committee member.

The number of sub-committees should be kept to minimum.

A chair should be selected and should report back to the Management Committee

A subcommittee may meet and adjourn as it considers appropriate.

A sub-committee has cannot make binding Management Committee decisions and have no financial powers.

Where required, sub-committees should present proposals, including budgets to the Management committee for discussion and approval.

Questions arising at a sub-committee meeting are to be decided by a majority vote of the members present at the meeting and, if the roles are equal, the question is decided in the negative.

Sub-Committees should always have regard to the achievement of the IFSC objectives and values as determined by the IFSC Management Committee.

Reasoning

Sub-committees can be a valuable method of introducing additional skills and experience and for delegating planning and/or implementation of initiatives with the desire to involve more members in actively achieving the clubs' objectives.
