



Membership Information

Senior and Ordinary Members (*parent or non-skating member*) - Shall be at least 18 years of age. They shall have the right to vote, hold office and enjoy all privileges and activities of the IFSC.

Junior and Sub-Junior Members (*membership include 1 x parent Ordinary Member*) - Shall be under the age of 18. They shall enjoy all privileges and activities of the IFSC.

On becoming a member, you are required to volunteer a minimum of 4 hours per year, as per the club Rules. Children over 15 years can volunteer where appropriate.

All operational costs, equipment, competitions, events, and financial subsidies are paid for by Club Fundraising activities.

All skating members will receive the following benefits:

- 1 Year Membership – April 1 to March 31
- Opportunity to participate in club competitions and ISQ tests.
- Opportunity to participate in subsidized athlete development programs, exhibitions, and events, subject to the minimum volunteering hours being met and from time to time, special criteria outlined for a specific event.
- On joining, receive a new members pack.
- Receive financial subsidies subject to meeting the IFSC Subsidy Policy.

All new membership applications are pending until approved by the IFSC Management Committee, regardless of payment being made. IFSC reserves the right to refuse a membership application.

Once a new or renewing member completes the online Membership application form including payment of membership fees, all Terms and Conditions listed below are deemed to be accepted.
